Directions to the iRIS-2026 venue: Ferguson Room, One A The Square

Glasgow University main Gilmorehill Campus is located in the west end of Glasgow, 3 miles from the city centre and just 7 miles from Glasgow International Airport. The nearest underground station is Hillhead Subway Station located on Byres Road. It is a 2–5 minute walk from the university's main building. Other nearby stations include Kelvinhall and Kelvinbridge.



At the very top of University Avenue you will find the main gate – see the top two images on the right.



Entering through the main gate, and walking straight ahead, you will face the imposing university building known as the Gilbert Scott Building, which is an iconic Gothic Revival structure designed by Sir George Gilbert Scott and occupied in 1870. Its distinctive bell tower and cloisters make it a notable landmark. It serves as the historic, administrative, and academic heart of the university.



Continue walking directly ahead and you will find the entrance to **One A The Square**. See the bottom image on the right. Follow the signs to The Bistro which will lead you to the location for this year's iRIS event.



We have one room for the exhibition and coffee breaks, one for the posters and the Ferguson Room where the summit presentations and workshops will be held.
